"Hurry up!" That's a command that is said on a daily basis at 110 Berkley. "Lollygagging" is frowned upon in our house, however, I believe that our children have a black belt in it! Why are we always in such a rush? Do you feel like life just never stops? I've been thinking about this concept a lot lately. Is it good to be busy? Should I feel bad that my days are planned out down to the minute? What does the Bible say about the increasing subject of busyness?

Let me start by saying that "busyness" does not equal sin! At different points in my life, I've felt as though the two were one in the same. The day and age that we live in generates a propensity for living life to the max, burning the candle at both ends. Why is this a problem? Many times we fill our lives with a lot of stuff. The problem occurs when we expect the stuff to fill us. Jesus touches on this principle in Luke 10:38-42. This passage tells the familiar story of Mary and Martha. Jesus arrives at Martha's house, and she spends the evening taking care of all of the "to-dos" while Mary simply sits at Jesus' feet. In verse 41 Jesus says "Martha, Martha, you are worried and bothered about so many things; but only one thing is necessary, for Mary has chosen the good part..." Martha spent her time focused on things that weren't necessarily bad, but they distracted her focus on Jesus.

Do you find yourself focusing on the wrong things? This concept is difficult for me. I like my schedule to be packed. I enjoy life when it is as my mom says, "just a blowin' and a goin". Again, this is not a bad thing. God's word teaches us, however, to stop. It teaches us to focus our busy lives on the things, or should I say, thing that is important.

Christ must be at the center of all that we do. As Christians, He is our life. Jesus impacts, or should impact, everything we do. He affects our thoughts, decisions, plans, actions, relationships, goals, speech, and on and on. If this is this case, shouldn't He affect our schedule? The psalmist writes in Psalm 46:10 "He says, be still and know that I am God." God wants us to take time to reassess.

It's important to slow down, to pause. Why do you think this is? When we refocus on who God is, we receive an accurate picture of who we are. It is easy to develop an inflated sense of self worth. I often need a reminder that this world doesn't revolve around me. Slowing down gives me the chance to refocus my life on the creator of this life. My encouragement to you is to take time. Life is busy. There's no doubt about it. Take time to spend with God. Spend time in His word. He will reveal Himself to you. Allow Him to mold you and shape you. Stop for a minute and smell the blessings. Wow, that was cheesy!. Busyness is a fact of life, but it doesn't have to be your life.
